

## Message from Jane Grant, Chief Executive (16 April 2021, 2pm)

I was delighted to see colleagues from Invercive Royal Hospital recognised last night in the Greenock Telegraph's Health and Care Awards 2021, with nominees and winners from across our teams. The hospital was the first in Scotland to be severely affected by COVID-19 in March of last year and staff have responded incredibly since then to the challenges of the pandemic.

Well done to the staff within G South Ward who won the Health Team of the Year Award and to Louise Tosh who has won Nurse of the Year. My congratulations also go to Dr Mun Woo and Dr Abby Gunn who were named as joint winners in doctor/GP of the Year Award. As we all get to more opportunities to meet up with our friends and families in the coming weeks it is very important that we keep testing to ensure our patients and colleagues are not at risk.

Finally, this week saw the start of Ramadan which will continue until Wednesday 12 May. I would like to take this opportunity to wish all our Muslim colleagues my very best wishes.

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
