### Second dose vaccination for staff

Staff are reminded that it is vital for you to receive both doses of your COVID-19 vaccine. For those staff members who are due to receive their second dose of Pfizer vaccine, a staff clinic is operating on Saturday 26 June. Please contact your line manager for the details of how to book your space.

For staff who have received AstraZeneca and are due a second dose, a drop-in clinic is in operation at the Glasgow Central Mosque tomorrow, Friday 25 and Sunday 27 June.

For staff members who cannot attend at these times, more opportunities will follow.

In June we marked What Matters To You Day through a series of events, spanning several days across our sites. # Scotland's Covid Memorial invitation to write an 'I remember'

Staff, patients, families and friends (from across Scotland) are being invited to participate in Scotland's Covid Memorial by writing an 'I remember'.

The 'I remember' form was devised by the American artist Joe Brainard. The only rule is that your submission must consist of a single sentence that begins, 'I remember...'

This simple form is a way to remember loved ones who passed away, or to record your own experience of the pandemic.

A wide-ranging selection will appear on the project blog, where they will be anonymised, and all contributions will be archived.

They will inform the final memorial, which is being created in Pollok Country Park, Glasgow, and at satellite venues.

For the sake of confidentiality please only use first names if you refer to people and you are welcome to contribute more than one 'I remember'.
