COVID-19 and Staff Returning to the Workplace

Managers are reminded that the Guidance on Social Distancing remains in place with working from home, the priority, where possible.

For managers whose staff may be returning to the workplace after a period of working from home:

- It is important to prepare staff prior to their return. As part of this preparation, managers should brief staff on the control measures in place to protect themselves and their colleagues, including; the wearing of face masks and the requirement to maintain two metre social distancing.
- Staff should also have the opportunity to review and discuss the social distancing risk assessments in place for their work area and where they are able to take breaks safely.
- To support managers, an enhanced return to work checklist is available on the COVID-19 page under <u>General staff guidance & resources</u>.

We would request that all staff are mindful of the possible anxieties of some staff who may be returning to the work place.

Workplace Temperature Guidelines

For all Managers: Please refer to the <u>Workplace Temperature Guidelines</u> for information relating to acceptable temperatures within the workplace.

It is recognised that the current hot weather we are experiencing may impact local workplaces and short term measures may be required.

The guidelines provide information to support decision making, a log to assess local conditions and information on who to get in touch with should require further information.
