Attend Anywhere/Near Me Drop in Sessions

Attend Anywhere, also known as NHS Near Me, is a secure NHS video consultation service available to staff in health boards across Scotland. The service has proven crucial for NHSGGC staff to continue treating many patients who would otherwise have had appointments cancelled, or postponed due to the pandemic. In the year to March, more than 170,500 Near Me consultations took place.

A survey from NHSGGC revealed that, of 3,481 Near Me patients, more than 98% would use the service again, with respondents highlighting key benefits as not having to travel for an appointment (83%), increased convenience (61%), and a more efficient use of time (58%).

In order to support staff who have undertaken rapid implementation of video consultation during the pandemic and those now preparing to return to routine service delivery, eHealth are providing a series of online drop-in sessions. These sessions will demonstrate how the system works, explain the implementation process and provide an opportunity for questions and answers.

- And improves overall patient care.


