

Community Treatment Centre for Brain Injury

The Community Treatment Centre for Brain Injury (CTCBI) provides person-centred goal-oriented community rehabilitation for adults living in the old Greater Glasgow NHS Board area with cognitive, psychological and communication difficulties as a result of an acquired brain injury.

Assessment and rehabilitation can take place in the centre, at the clients' homes and in their local communities where clinically appropriate.

The service is provided by an interdisciplinary team consisting of occupational therapists, a speech and language therapist and clinical psychologists.

CTCBI Admission Criteria

To be eligible for referral to the Community Treatment Centre for Brain Injury the person must:

- reside within the Greater Glasgow NHS Board boundaries
- be over 16 years of age
- have a non-progressive neurological condition (not including CVA)
- have difficulties that are primarily related to cognitive, psychological, and/or behavioural impairment rather than physical impairment
- be medically stable
- have no major/active psychiatric disorder
- require an interdisciplinary approach focusing on community integration
- where appropriate have family/carers who are willing to be involved in the rehabilitation process
- have no other significant medical condition that precludes active involvement in a rehabilitation programme
