Allied Health Profession (AHP) Clinical Lead – Connecting People, Connecting Support (CPCS) May Flash Report

NHSGGC secured funding to appoint an AHP Clinical Lead for CPCS (1 day a week for 1 year) which links directly to the AHP Director and AHP Dementia Consultant. The project is due to end in April 2025.

Key priorities for the year will be aligned to the Connecting People, Connecting Support Strategy and this position works with the National AHP Dementia Forum.

The CPCS Strategy outlines how AHP's in Scotland can support people with a diagnosis of dementia, their families and carers to have positive, fulfilling and independent lives for as long as possible. The aspiration is that people living with dementia will have better access to a range of AHP's regardless of age, place of residence and throughout the course of their illness.

Visible and easy access to AHP expertise through self management information and targeted interventions at the earliest time.

Services led by AHP's skilled in high quality personal outcome focused dementia care. They will lead quality improvement and share best practice. AHP's that understand **they** are experts in the impact of **their** disease on **their** lives.

The right support delivered in partnership in the right place and time.

Therapists who are committed to high quality, rights based, person centred AHP rehabilitation who will drive improvement, innovation and research.
