

Clinical Portal – ACP Summary Guide for GP Practices

This guide provides information for GP Practices on NHSGGC Clinical Portal

■ NHSGGC Clinical Portal ACP Summary

The purpose is to deliver a standardised approach to ACP and Frailty identification across all HSCPs within Greater Glasgow and Clyde Partnership area.

There is only one active ACP Summary on the **Clinical Portal**. Older versions are clearly marked as 'Closed' at the top of the document and cannot be updated.

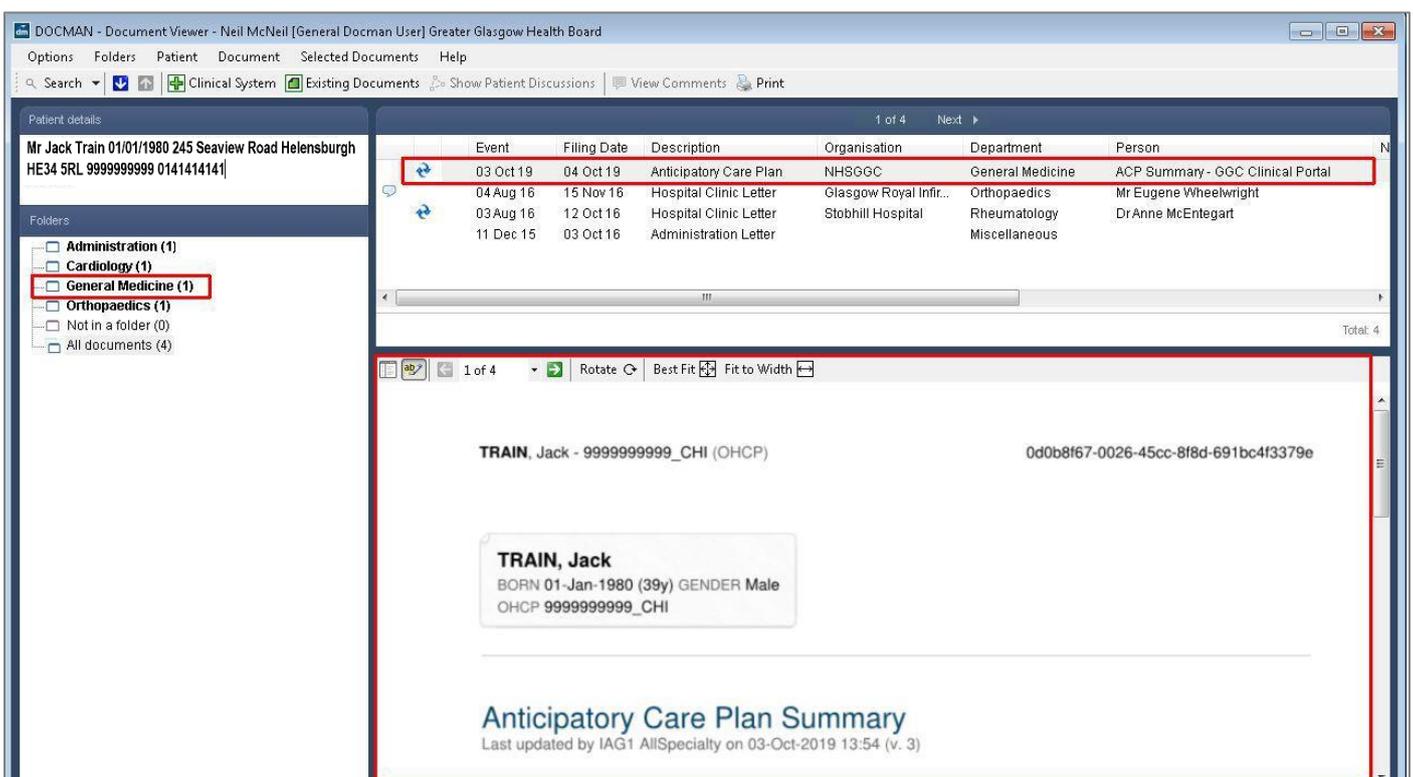
■ Viewing the ACP Summary via the GP Practice DocMan System

A copy of the completed ACP Summary (including updates) is sent using Electronic Document Transfer to the patient's GP Practice DocMan system. The ACP Summary will appear within the File Documents screen awaiting filing and will be easily identifiable as it will be tagged 'ACP' in the Batch List. The document can then be filed into the patient's DocMan record.

Once the document has been filed into the patient DocMan record, it is stored in the 'General Medicine' folder with the Description 'Anticipatory Care Plan'.

GP's have the option to copy any relevant information from the ACP Summary into the patient's Key Information Summary. To enable this the file is sent to DocMan as a PDF document. It is not possible to copy and paste directly from the PDF in the DocMan system itself therefore:

- Open the ACP Summary document to view within the patients DocMan record – see screenshot 1 below;
- Press F2 twice on the keyboard to open up the ACP Summary in Adobe Acrobat* - see screenshot 2 below;
- Text in the PDF can then be highlighted for copy/paste

■ Viewing the ACP Summary in the NMSGC Clinical Portal

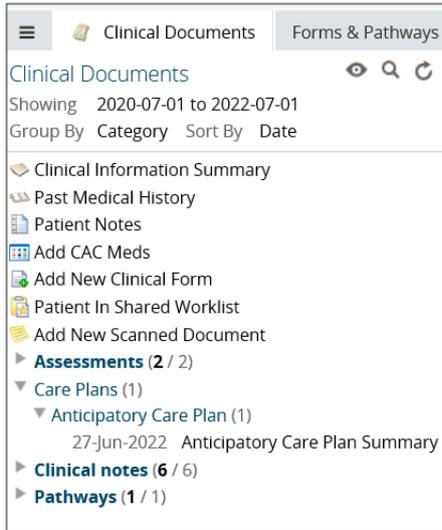
The GP Practice can also login to the NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde Clinical Portal and view the active ACP Summary for a patient within their practice (assumes an ACP Summary has been created).

- Login to **Clinical Portal** and search for a patient in the usual way
- Within the Clinical Documents tab on the patient record, the location of the ACP Summary will be dependent on the default view you have set-up:

Document Category View

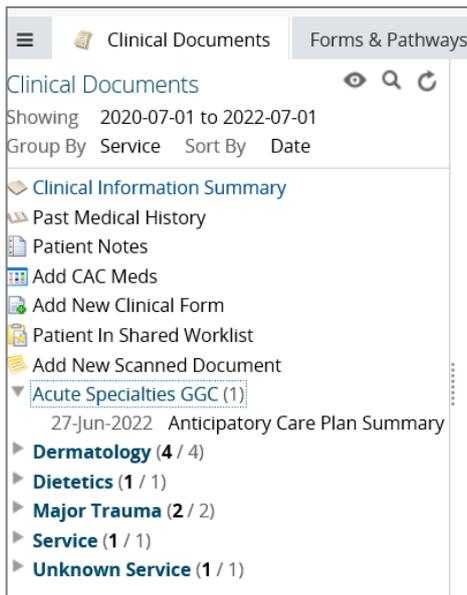
