## Campus Overview

Glasgow Royal Infirmary is located to the east of Glasgow City Centre and is the main inpatient hospital for the north and east of NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde's area. The map overleaf details where the major departments are located to allow easy access to your appointment.

### Walking and Cycling

There is an excellent network of pedestrian and cycling facilities connecting Glasgow Royal Infirmary to neighbouring communities, Queen Street railway station, High Street railway station, Buchanan bus station and Glasgow City Centre.

Cycling is a great way to travel to the hospital, if able, especially for visitors and staff. There are shared access routes to the hospital campus with public bike hire station facilities at Glasgow Cathedral, University of Strathclyde and Buchanan bus station. Designated cycle parking is located across the campus.

## 🚶🚇 By Rail or Subway to Hospitals

Buchanan Street Subway station and Queen Street Railway Station; A 20-minute walk to Castle Street entrance (just under 1 mile). Buses to the hospital are First Bus 38, 38A, 38B, 38C, 57, 57A and Stagecoach X19.

High Street Railway Station is less than a 10-minute walk to Castle Street entrance (approximately 0.5 miles).

M8 motorway to junction 15, then follow signs for Cathedral and Glasgow Cross, then follow signs for the hospital.

## 🚗🚼 Car Parking and Disabled Parking

There are drop off and pick bays in the hospital grounds for main department entrances. Patient and visitor car parking is available, but car parks and surrounding areas are often busy, so please consider other travel options such as bus or train, if they are a suitable alternative. Car parking is free, but there is a 4-hour maximum stay. There is a multi-storey car park next to Accident and Emergency entrance, with dedicated floors for patients and visitors, with blue badge spaces on the ground floor. Car Park attendants are available to provide advice if required.
