## IPCQIN Steering & Operational Group Merge

It was agreed in Summer 2023 that the Steering Group and the Operational group would merge into one group – the IPCQIN.

- Revised ToR was shared and approved by the group in November 2023.
- The scope of the membership for the group was reviewed.
- The group will continue to report to the Quality Strategy Group.
- The group will meet bi-monthly in the first instance the last meeting took place on the 9th January 2024.

## **1. Person Centred Care - Infection Prevention and Control**

Initial findings from the questionnaire are that a high number of patients would like more electronic versions of the Patient Information Leaflets to read on their tablet or phone.

## 2. Standard Infection Control Precautions (SICPs) Workstream

Following review of both ward led audits and audits undertaken by IPCT, it has been agreed that the report will focus on areas of improvement from results of the audits undertaken by the IPCT. Once complete, a report will be submitted to the committees for review and this will form the education for improvement.

*Review of hand hygiene audit tool and methodology – led by LBHHC, Stefan Morton is currently underway.* 

# **3.** Reducing Infections Associated with the Use of Invasive Access Devices

### **SAB Group Updates**

The focus continues on PVC and CVC infections, and the group will also be considering the urinary catheter care bundle.

### **Current Activity:**

- Local Sector education sessions.
- Collation of photographic examples of well and poorly taken venflons to aid education work.
- Review shared learning from SAB cases.
- Print and disseminate and promote SAB information poster (Regional & North)
- MDT educational sessions planned
- Benchmarking against the other renal services in Scotland/established standards, suggest 3 areas that require improvement: shortfalls in VA specialist nurse provision, clinic provision and access to theatres.
- In parallel the renal nursing teams are developing more accessible educational resources on dialysis access care. The Regional Services nursing team continue to develop the systems of audit supporting best PVC practice being maintained.
