Glasgow City Health Improvement Training Calendar offers different levels of training, ranging from 'informed' through to 'specialist'. It offers a variety of options for your organisation.

Informed	Baseline knowledge and skills required by all staff working in health, social care and third sector settings.
Skilled	Knowledge and skills required by staff who have direct and/or substantial contact with individuals at risk of self-harm and/or suicide.
Enhanced	Knowledge and skills required by staff who have more regular and intense contact with those who may be at risk or/affected by mental ill health.
Specialist	Knowledge and skills required by staff who, by virtues of their role and practice setting, provide an expert specialist role in the assessment, care, treatment and support of those affected by mental ill health. They often have leadership roles in education, training and service coordination and development, e.g. staff working within specialist mental health services.
