

Learning Intentions:

We are learning how to keep ourselves safe from second hand smoke

Success Criteria:

I can:

- describe what is meant by second hand smoke
- describe why second hand smoke is bad for me
- describe what actions others can take to keep me safe from second hand smoke


Register for programme by Thursday 30th November 2023.

All classes who submit a name will receive certificates of participation for every pupil with a list of all winning schools and names (April-May 2024)



Activity

Before the activity, set up the video for playback on your PC smartboard/monitor

- 1. Watch the video with your pupils
- 2. Discuss the story with the class





- Why was being near smoking bad for Jenny and her bear?
- What did the Doctor suggest Jenny's mummy and daddy could do to help?
- 3. Ask the children what name they would give to Jenny's bear, agree on a class name and enter the Name the Teddy competition
- 4. Distribute the booklets and ask the pupils to take home. Parents and carers can be asked to read the story with their children as a homework task and colour in the picture at the back of the book
- 5. Return class teddy name via email to:
