

Lieutenant Colonel Rachel Emmerson OBE

Lt Col Rachel Emmerson commissioned into the Royal Logistic Corps (RLC) in 1999 after reading Pharmacology at Leeds University. As a junior officer she served in Germany and the Falkland Islands before completing the Ammunition Technical Officers Course and serving at Defence Munitions Kineton. She returned to Regimental duty with the RLC as both a Regimental Operations Officer and Officer Commanding of a Close Support Squadron. She has deployed on operations to Bosnia, Iraq and Afghanistan. The highlight was deploying as a Combat Logistic Patrol Commander on Operation HERRICK 16.

Following staff roles at the Army Personnel Centre and as Deputy Chief of Staff of 1 Armoured Infantry Brigade she was fortunate to attend the Advanced Command and Staff Course and gain a Masters in Defence Studies. Appointments then followed in the Permanent Joint Headquarters and most recently as SO1 Diversity and Inclusion in Army Headquarters, a role which was both demanding and rewarding.
