Literacy and Numeracy Skills Qualifications - Guide for prospective nursing students in Scotland

In order to undertake the nursing degree programme prospective candidates must have a certain level of literacy and numeracy as set out by the Nursing and Midwifery Council. These are the equivalent to SCQF Level 5.

The **Scottish** qualifications that evidence these are English and Maths at any of the following:

Intermediate 2 Standard Grade (Credit Level) National 5 O Grade (A or B)

If you have undertaken other study such as national certificate, HNC or HND courses you may have undertaken units that have demonstrated this level of study. You can check this by using MYSQA website which you can access at Home (mysqa.org.uk)


One you have registered you should click on 'my results'



Then tick 'show SCQF' box:



Scroll down to 'core skill' Communication and Numeracy and click on the + to open up the box to show your evidenced skills:



If you have **Communication: Oral Communication** and **Communication: Written Communication** at **Intermediate 2** or above then you have the **literacy** requirements for entry to the programme.

If you have **Numeracy: Using Graphical Information**, and **Numeracy: Using Number** at **Intermediate 2** or above than you have the **numeracy** requirements for entry to the programme.

If you do not have the required literacy and/or numeracy skills these are some open learning options based in Scotland which may take 80 hours or less study to complete.
