

Review of Minor Injuries Services for West Glasgow

The <u>Glasgow City Integration Joint Board</u> (IJB) considered proposals to review minor injuries services for West Glasgow on <u>21st June 2017</u>.

Summary

The Glasgow City Integrated Joint Board manages the strategic planning of unplanned heath care. This includes minor injuries services.

The proposal to review options for minor injuries services in West Glasgow looked at:

- How accessible minor injuries services are for people in Greater Glasgow and Clyde
- How many people need to use minor injuries services
- The money required to run minor injuries services
- How we involved and engaged with patients and the public.

The review took place after Yorkhill minor injuries unit closed on a temporary basis in December 2016.

Options Appraisal

A Review and Stakeholder Group (Review Group) was established with patient representation.

The Review Group undertook an option appraisal exercise to assess three options for minor injuries services in West Glasgow.

Engagement Events

A series of <u>engagement events</u> were held in September 2017. The review was also discussed at a <u>North West Locality Engagement Forum meeting</u>.

Following the engagement, a <u>consultation outcome report</u> was shared with the IJB in November 2017.
