



### **Mumps Aide Memoire**

#### Consult Guidance and isolate in a single room with:

- ✓ ensuite / own commode
- ✓ door closed
- ✓ IPC yellow sign on door
- √ dedicated equipment
- ✓ Care Checklist completed daily



- ✓ Stop isolation
- ✓ undertake terminal clean of room

## Guidance - Guidelines for patients in isolation:

<u>Hand Hygiene:</u> Liquid Soap and Water or alcohol based hand rub

#### PPE:

A fluid repellent Type 11R surgical mask and disposable yellow plastic apron and gloves should be worn for all routine care of the patient.

Where there is a risk of splashing of blood/body fluids to the face, eye protection should be considered and worn during AGPs.

An FFP3 mask must be worn during AGPs and the appropriate fallow time after the procedure depending on the air changes in the room.

<u>Patient Environment:</u> Twice daily chlorine clean

<u>Patient Equipment:</u> Chlorine clean after use and at least on a twice daily basis

**Laundry:** Treat as infected

<u>Waste:</u> Dispose of as Clinical / Healthcare waste

<u>Incubation Period:</u> 17 days within a range of 14 - 25 days

<u>Period of Communicability:</u> 7 days before, until 5 days after the onset of parotid swelling

Notifiable disease: Yes

<u>Transmission route:</u> direct, indirect

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
