



Clinical Supervision Resource Group





These sticks are designed to help clinical supervision conversations. They are designed so that they:

- are aligned to proctors model in the <u>NHS GG&C AHP clinical supervision policy</u> to encourage a breadth of discussion
- · are easy to understand and use
- · facilitate a conversation between the supervisor and supervisee
- · compliment the NES flash cards and any other resources NHSGG&C develop


They are not intended to replace training in skill development or act as an educational tool for the supervisor. They are being developed from informal feedback that starting a conversation or 'knowing what to talk about' can be sticking points in any clinical supervision discussion.

ow they work


There are 6 different coloured sticks, it is anticipated that the green sticks, the openers, will be used at the start to begin the conversation and the red, action stick, at the end of the session. In between the support, standards and development (restorative, normative and formative) can be used in any order in the middle with the prompts as required.

Start by laying the sticks out on the table grouped in their colours. The green (openers) at the start and the red (action) at the end. The heart of the conversation will be around proctors model of support, standards and development (pink, blue and orange) and these sticks can be laid out in the middle.

Prompts can be used by the supervisor at any stage in the conversation to help generate insight for the Supervisee


