ICE Requests, Handwritten forms and Sample Transport

<u>Please note</u>: The joint Biochemistry and Haematology Request form and Transport bags are not for use in the North Sector. Please order the correct forms from PECOS using the codes below.

<u>Remember</u>: All samples should be placed into clear plastic sample bags. One bag per patient. Samples for different laboratory departments should be placed in the appropriate transport bags.

Changes to Cardiolipin Service

We are making some changes to the cardiolipin service in NHSGGC and there are some important changes that you need to be aware of. From 1st August 2019 all cardiolipin work will be carried out by the Haemostasis lab at Glasgow Royal Infirmary. Please note there is a change of sample type associated with this, a 3.5ml sodium citrate sample is required.

It will not be possible for the Immunology lab to process cardiolipin requests after 1st August 2019; nor will we be able to forward samples for testing as the haematology test requires a different sample type.
