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1. Introduction

The Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act requires public sector contracting authorities with regulated procurement activity of £5 million or more per annum to have prepared a Procurement Stategy, and to publish an Annual Procurement Report each financial year. I am pleased to approve and publish the NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde's report for financial year 2021/22.

This report covers a procurement spend for the period of £763m. There were 95 regulated procurements awarded in this period with an life time value of £103.9m, securing best value for Board spend, whilst obtaining financial and non-financial savings; through a commitment to maintaining high quality patient focused care by delivering sustainable and affordable clinical services with the capacity and capability to deliver modern healthcare with the flexibility to adapt to future requirements, through a positive approach to Fair Work and sustainability outcomes, including Community Benefits.

This report gives recognition of the impact that procurement policy and practice has on the Boards main objectives; Better Care, Better Health, Better Value, Better Workplace and can show the positive impact on performance and success.

The ongoing Covid-19 pandemic with different variants has continued to put pressure on the team and the Board with staff sickness levels continuing to be high. This has affected the support we could provide to all internal stakeholders as we had to prioritise projects undertaken. The Board was given additional capital funding for medical and non-medical equipment and the department had to provide resource to ensure this money was spent and receipted within the financial year.

2. Overview

1.1 Purpose of this Report

NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (the Board) provides a comprehensive range of healthcare services principally to 1.3 million people in the Health Board area and also hosts a range of regional and national services. The Board purchases goods and services from a broad range of suppliers in support of these activities. As a public body this purchasing must be carried-out in accordance with the prevailing legislation including the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 and the Public Contracts (Scotland) Regulations 2015.

These regulations require the Board to publish an Annual Procurement report covering content prescibed by the legislation. NHS GG&C financial year runs for the period 1st April 2021 to 31st March 2022. This report covers that period and is aligned to the Boards Annual Procurement Strategy.

1.2 Purchasing Strategy

NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (the Board) has an annual trade influenceable spend with third party suppliers of approximately £763m per annum. This expenditure is committed on behalf of the Board via the following five lead procuring departments.

These departments provide a comprehensive procurement and logistics service for all Health Board functions. This includes strategic sourcing and advice to improve effectiveness and value for money on all expenditure for goods, services and works. The departments have responsibility for purchase requirements for all Board areas including Corporate, Acute and Partnerships Divisions and operate within the context of the Board's published Procurement Strategy.

This Procurement Strategy sets out the basis for all procurement activity across GG&C. In summary this strategy continues to ensure GG&C's procurement service aligns with local and national strategies. It is intended to focus the procuring departments in delivering the highest level of service to End Users whilst delivering best value goods and services.

The strategy sets out clear, measurable objectives and priorities for improvement. Compliance and progress against these strategic objectives is reported quarterly to the Procurement Steering Group and annually to GG&C's CEO/Directors/Chief Officers meeting.

Summary of Regulated Procurements Completed

The Board has awarded 95 regulated procurements with a life time value of £103.9m during the period 1st April 2021 – 31st March 2022.

3. Community Benefit Summary Procurement

The Board considers Community Benefits in all local tendering activity. An assessment is carried out to decide whether a scored or non-scored Community Benefits question is relevant and proportionate to the contract. 22 local contracts have been awarded so far this financial vear and 19 of these contracts included either а scored nonor scored community benefits question. Feedback from suppliers include the following -

Apprentices: 2Mentors: 2Volunteers: 50Trainees: 15

Student Placements: 3Work Experience: 2

One supplier has volunteer groups who assist with community meals, cooking courses and drop in gardens for the community. Most suppliers state they have close links with volunteer groups and universities. Volunteers run workshops and activity days for service users

One supplier has stated that they have 5 established cafes in the local area which are all run by volunteers. The volunteers also run workshops and activity groups for recovery programmes.

One supplier stated they have a number of unwaged work experience places they offer in the local community, skill seeker positions and modern apprenticeships.

One supplier has helped numerous patients benefit from becoming college students

One supplier stated that approx. 53 of the volunteers they had have now gone on to find full time permanent positions throughout various different organisations

One supplier advised that 70% of their staff are local residents, 20% of staff were service users who started working as volunteers and later progresses to paid employment. They also stated that 8 members of their staff are provided with 2 days per annum to provide volunteer work in the community.

4. Capital Planning Community Benefits Summary

During the construction of Greenock Health Centre working with the main Contractor BAM the following was achieved -

- Created 16 employment opportunities
- Supported 25 apprentices' across the project including a Foundation Apprentice
- Supported 9 work experience placements including the delivery of a virtual work experience programme
- Engaged in 12 educational activities and supported two groups of pupils from Notre Dame and St Stephen's High Schools
- Delivered 24 training opportunities for the workforce
- Invested over £13,000 in supporting local projects from the Fellowship Church, In Works and hWS appeals

Whilst on site, the project team have created great relationships with In Works, the Fellowship Church, Inverclyde Trust and Well Park Children's Centre.

During the construction of Clydebank Health Centre and working with the main Contractor BAM the following was achieved:

- Created 6 employment opportunities and one graduate employment opportunity
- Supported 6 apprentices
- Supported 12 work experience placements
- Engaged in 6 educational activities with Clydebank High School and West College, Scotland.

5. Supported Business Summary

The Board continues to seek opportunities to use Supported Businesses where practical.

Contract GGC0537 for Asset Disposal & Resale - Lot 2 was awarded to CCL North a Supported Business in line with Article 19 of the EU public procurement directive and enacted in Regulation 7 of the Public Contracts (Scotland) Regulation 2012). This is a Zero Cost Contract and NHSGGC incur no costs resulting from the provision of this service. Any monies received for the equipment remains with the awarded supplier.

Spend with Supported Business in this reporting period is lower than in previous years due to the ongoing impact of the Covid-19. This is summarised in the table below

6. Future Regulated Procurements Summary

Section 18(2) of the Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 states it is mandatory that an annual procurement report must include "a summary of the regulated procurements the authority expects to commence in the next two financial years." This is shown in the attached Appendix 2.

7. Delivering Value for Money

7.1 Contract Savings

Working with Clinical colleagues the Procurement Department has a critical role in supporting the delivery of the Clinical Services aims, specifically in procuring the best quality, and value for money goods and services to ensure patients receives the highest standard of care. £933,158 of recurring and non-recurring savings was achieved in the reporting period by price reduction across goods and services purchased by wards and departments.

7.2 Capital Equipment Purchase

The Board replaces higher value medical equipment via its capital expenditure allocation. The Procurement Department works closely with clinical colleagues to ensure the maximum value is obtained against the budget allowance. Savings achieved during the period of approx £3.549m achieved by reducing the cost of purchase are re-invested into additional equipment essential for patient care.

8. Sustainable Procurement Duty

The Procurement Reform (Scotland) Act 2014 requires authorities to comply with the sustainable procurement duty where applicable. This includes a requirement to support Small and Medium Enterprise (SME), Third Sector Bodies and Supported Business organisations gaining public contracts. The Board seeks to ensure that we meet this duty by adopting the Scottish Governments Procurement Journey methodology and use of contract strategy templates.

During this reporting period the Board has implemented the following specific initiatives:

- a) Promotion of Innovation Procurement Officers must consider ways of promoting innovation in all regulated procurements, examples may include whether allowing a variant solution for all or part of the requirement would be in the best interests to the Board.
- b) Sustainability Toolkit To assist with the segmentation of our supply base, the Scottish Governments Sustainability Toolkit has been used to identify our top risk, key suppliers to ensure contract and supplier management is taking place with our key suppliers.
- c) **WARPit** The Board have worked with WARPit to incorporate this ethos within our Board and all staff can access it via our Internal Web page. This portal makes it easy for Board staff to share surplus items (furniture, equipment etc.) with other

individuals. Many unwanted items are often put to waste; however, WARPit makes transfer of ownership quick and easy due to better communication.

WARPit will help limit the amount of waste the Board sends to landfill and reduce both our disposal costs and our carbon footprint. Re-using furniture and office supplies saves money spent on purchasing new equipment and helps to free-up the space occupied by unused equipment. Each transaction is monitored and every participant is registered, which means that waste disposal obligations and legal liability concerns are met. The portal also provides detailed up-to-date information on both the environmental benefits and financial savings generated.

This has been successful allowing the Board to not only make a Cost Avoidance saving of £98,929 but has reduced the number of items sent to landfill. The process includes working with Scottish SMEs, Support Business refurbish furniture where required.

The figure is reduced this year due to less decommissioning taking place within the Board.

9. Community Wealth Building

The Procurement Department has been working with colleagues in the Public Health and Health Improvement teams to ensure that Procurement plays a part within the Community Wealth Building Agenda and in the Board's role as an Anchor Institution. Anchor Institutions are large organisations, connected to their local area that use their assets and resources to benefit the communities around them.

In 2021/22, the Procurement Department, working with Public Health and the Health Anchors Learning Network (HALN), successfully applied for grant funding from the Health Foundation to take forward an initiative looking at our spend with local suppliers within the six local authority areas that NHS GG&C covers and how we might grow this.

The objective of the programme of activities is to increase the proportion of trade spend with local suppliers from the current level of 12% of trade spend in order to open up more local employment opportunities.

The Board has commissioned and is working closely with the <u>Supplier Development Programme</u> to host a series of webinars aimed at small-medium businesses within the Health Board area and have targeted three forthcoming regulated procurement activities to promote where we anticipate high levels of interest from local SMEs. The Head of Procurement has also spoken about the initiative at the Procurement for Health (P4H) Conference in Edinburgh in April 2022 and will be speaking again at the forthcoming Public Sector Procurement Conference (Procurex) in October 2022
