- Practice on manikins first
- Ensure close supervision when just learning a procedure





How do you think it feels to perform procedures on patients for the first time?

- Exciting
- Nerve-wracking
- Like you are starting to play a role in the team
- Frustrating if it doesn't go well
- Incredibly satisfying if it does go well





How do you think patients feel when they know a student is just learning?

- A lot of patients are happy to be helping
- Some are nervous and can get frustrated if things aren't going well
- Some refuse
- Important they know there is a safety net and they can opt out





Do you think we have to consent patients when they are helping a medical student with their learning?

- Absolutely. Yes.
- How do we do this? Truthfully but ensuring the patient is aware the student is fully supervised and they can withdraw consent at any point.





Do you think it should just be up to doctors to teach medical students – or are other members of the team important in this?

- Different members of the team have different skills and different things to offer.
- Important medical students don't think doctors are "better" than the other staff...they are not - just different.
- Important not to overburden other members of the team
 with teaching though they all have their own jobs to do also.
