Aim	This SOP aims to ensure a consistent, standardised approach to the management of eating drinking and swallowing difficulties across partnership services including HSCP community services; paediatrics (including acute and CAMHS); adult Mental Health and in patient; learning disability services across a variety of in-patient and community settings.			
Scope	This SOP covers all children and adults, within NHSGGC partnerships and applies to all clinical and HSCP staff involved with the care of people with eating, drinking and swallowing disorders. Scope is limited is limited to dysphagia involving the oral cavity and pharynx. Oesophageal swallowing disorders and behavioural oro-feeding difficulties in children are not included within the remit of this SOP

## Oropharyngeal Swallowing Problems Generic - Standard Operating Procedure

New or Existing Acute, new symptoms of dysphagia

Existing, chronic or changing symptoms of sysphagia

Current Situation

To gather and full document **new oropharyngeal dysphagia.**This should include level of concern, who is concerned, current health status and existing conditions.

To gather and fully document **new oropharyngeal dysphagia.**This should include level of concern, what you observe, current health status, existing conditions, changes and whether dysphagia recommendations exist/ are followed.

Communication

Ensure concerns are discussed with client /parent/ carer /POA & other relevant professionals / MDT & fully documented, seek appropriate consent and escalate to SLT as per local process

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**Actions** 

Refer to local Practice guidance for the appropriate care groups:

- 1. Community adults
- 2. Paediatrics (including acute)
- 3. Adult mental health and learning disability in patient.
