Infection Control and Uniform Policy

We would like to remind all of our staff to pay careful attention to infection prevention and control, as this is a vital part of keeping our patients safe.

Patients who are in hospital can be more vulnerable to catching illnesses and infections, which can result in making existing medical conditions worse and delaying their recovery as well as being life threatening in some cases.

It is therefore crucial to take any steps that can help prevent infection occurring including following the NHSGGC uniform policy.

By following this policy, you are also ensuring a professional image is portrayed to our patients, giving additional confidence to those using NHSGGC services.

Also, as a member of NHSGGC, it is your responsibility to keep up to date with current infection control policies and follow these at all times. You must also ensure that you have completed your Statutory & Mandatory Learn pro modules, including Standard Infection Control Precautions.

Dates announced for flu & COVID-19 staff vaccinations

Summer is sadly drawing to a close and, as we now head into the colder months, we're advising eligible staff to make plans to receive their winter vaccinations, to protect themselves and their patients.

The rollout of this winter vaccination programme is designed to provide eligible staff with the opportunity to get ahead of flu and COVID-19 in a timeframe that enables the most vulnerable people to receive the maximum protection during peak virus periods. Dates for receiving vaccines are staggered between non-frontline and frontline staff.

Who is eligible for winter vaccinations?

All health and social care staff members are eligible to receive the flu vaccination.

You will only receive the COVID-19 vaccination if you have face-to-face contact with patients or service users, unless you are eligible because of your age, carer status and/or health condition.

What date can I receive my vaccine/s?

- Non-frontline Health and Social Care team members 4 September 1 October 2023
- Frontline health and social care team members 2 October 15 October 2023

For all non-frontline Health and Social Care staff who are eligible for a flu vaccination only, the online booking portal has gone live, or you can also book your appointment by contacting 0800 030 8013.

For all frontline Health and Social Care staff, who are eligible for flu and COVID vaccination, the online booking portal will go live on the 28 August or by contacting 0800 030 8013 on the same day.

Why will frontline staff receive their vaccine later?

If you are frontline staff, you are eligible for the COVID-19 and flu vaccine. You are encouraged to receive both. If you are opting to receive both, they will be administered at the same time following recommendations from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI).

JCVI advice is also that protection is highest in the three months following vaccination, so vaccinating those at highest risk of COVID-19 later provides greater protection over the peak winter period and into the New Year.

How can I book?

Will there be drop-in clinics?

Yes, our aim is to make getting vaccinated as easy as possible for staff. Drop-in buses will be available at NHSGGC sites between 4 September and 15 October.
