### REGULATION


Amendments to the National Health Service (Pharmaceutical Services) (Scotland) Regulations 2009 were made in June 2014, introducing changes to public consultation arrangements in respect of applications to join a Health Board's Pharmaceutical List.

The amended arrangements require an Intended Applicant (IA) to work with the Board and undertake a joint public consultation. The consultation must aim to reach, as far as possible, the majority of residents within an identified neighbourhood in which the proposed premises are located. At the end of the consultation, an agreed Consultation Analysis Report (CAR) must be sent to the Pharmacy Practices Committee (PPC) Chair.

### CONSULTATION PURPOSE

The aim of the public consultation was to:

- Assess the views of local people as to whether they believe there was adequate access to pharmacy services within the neighbourhood identified by the Intended Applicant (outlined on map below) for premises proposed at 500 Corselet Road, Old Darnley Mill, Darnley, Glasgow G53 7RN.
- Measure the level of public support for a new pharmacy in this area.



Location map of premises and neighbourhood identified by Sycamore Mill LLP.

**North**: From the M77 at the junction with Kennishead Road, follow the railway line until the bridge at Nitshill Road.

**West**: From Nitshill Road, travel down to the junction with Wiltonburn Road. Follow Wiltonburn Road onto Willowford Road until the junction with Whitriggs Road. Follow Whitriggs Road down to Parkmanor Avenue continuing over open fields and crossing Brock Burn until it meets Leggatston Avenue.

**South**: Leggatston Avenue to the M77, encompassing Patterton Range Drive.

**East**: Follow the M77 until it meets the junction with Kennishead Road.

### **METHODOLOGY**

The Health Board and Sycamore Mill LLP initially met on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2021. A subsequent Joint Consultation Meeting took place on 9<sup>th</sup> July 2021 during which the public consultation content, scope, methods of public engagement and commencement date were agreed and a Consultation Plan developed (**Appendix 1**). The consultation commenced on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2021 and ended on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2021, a total of 90 working days. The public holidays on 24<sup>th</sup> September 2021, 27<sup>th</sup> September 2021, 27<sup>th</sup> December 2021, 28<sup>th</sup> December 2021, 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2022 and 4<sup>th</sup> January 2022 occurred during this consultation and as such were discounted.

On 16<sup>th</sup> September 2021 the consultation commenced through the following:

- Glasgow Times Newspaper Advertisement (Appendix 2)
- NHSGG&C Social Media Programme (Appendix 3)
- Stakeholders notified by NHSGG&C (**Appendix 4**)
- Questionnaire appearing on Board Website (**Appendix 5**)

All communications encouraged responses using the electronic questionnaire available from the Board's website during the consultation period.

In recognition that some members of the public would not be able to access the electronic questionnaire, it was also made available (on request) in paper format and translated in other languages. A large font type paper version was also available.

In recognition that some of the public might not wish to complete the questionnaire but would like to make general comments (letter/email), it was agreed that if received, comments would also be included within the CAR. **No such comments were received.** 

Details of further activity undertaken during the Joint Consultation Exercise is detailed at Appendix 1

### **CONSULTATION SUMMARY**

In 2020 the population of the neighbourhood identified by the Intended Applicant was 9,091 (Small Area Population Estimate - SAPE). This figure comprised as follows:

The public consultation would however have been available to a much wider population, including people living in the wider area around the neighbourhood as well as those commuting into this general area e.g. for employment.

As shown in the map below, part of the neighbourhood also fell within datazone SO1009782. The population within these datazones are not included in the total of 9,091as the majority of the area (and therefore the population) is out with the shaded area representing the Intended Applicant's defined neighbourhood.



During the consultation period: 0 postal questionnaires and 184 electronic questionnaires were received. Of the 184 questionnaires received 99% were submitted from individuals. 50 paper copies of the questionnaire were requested by the Intended Applicant; however there were no other requests from members of the public for questionnaires in paper, large font type or, translated in other languages.


The majority of the survey responders:

- Agreed with the proposed neighbourhood for the pharmacy 168 (92.3%);
- Agreed this was a good location for a pharmacy 143 (77.7%)
- Live within the proposed neighbourhood 169 (91.8%)
- Agreed existing pharmaceutical services provided to the neighbourhood are adequate – 100 (54.9%)
- Agreed the proposed Monday-Friday opening hours were just right 127 (69.0%)
- Agreed the proposed Saturday opening hours were just right 114 (62.3%)
- Agreed the proposed Sunday opening hours were just right 119 (65.0%)
- Supported the opening of a new pharmacy in Old Darnley Mill 142 (77.6%) and
- Agreed the proposed pharmacy would have an impact on other healthcare providers (either negatively or positively) 108 (59.3%)

Both parties noted agreeing to this report that responses appeared to be personalised and made independently given the range of opinions expressed and vocabulary used.

### **Timeline**





### Responses

It hasn't taken into consideration, Nitshill Road towards neighbouring Sainsburys where there is already a pharmacy.

Houlihan's pharmacy in Darnley Mains covers the area to the right quite well. This pharmacy will be of benefit to those in South Nitshill (areas on the other side of Willowford road and Dove Street), and if a Go surgery is also put on the same site.

Area is already covered with pharmacy facilities. No one from Patterson range area is going to by pass Houllihans to go to Corslet Road.

It does not take in the neighbourhood in close proximity which is Millview Place G537RE and the new build estate Darnley Mill crescent G53 7AZ

The area not mentioned is Darnley, Southpark Village and Parkhouse which neighbour this area (x2)

Proposed area covers Darnley, including all of the new developments in the area.





NHS Pharmacy First Service - this service replaced the Minor Ailment Service and Pharmacy First Services. A service provided by the Community Pharmacy when a patient presents with a minor illness.

Pharmaceutical Public Health Services - smoking cessation, supply of emergency hormonal contraception and provision of gluten free foods.


Medication Care and Review - to enable Community Pharmacy Teams to support patients with long term conditions.

Substance Misuse Services - e.g. Needle Exchange Services, Opiate Substitution Therapy. Stoma Service – appliance supply for patient with a colostomy or urostomy.

The area is currently under going major development of new housing bringing more people to the area. Most houses being built are of large size and house large sized families. There's is a need for more amenities in the area. Particularly a pharmacy. The current houihan offers a great service but parking is limited and can be difficult to get to a difficult times as it is on a very busy route towards school/sainsburys and fast food - the new tool station site across from the Houlihan has made it even more difficult to access parking

Hopefully they will offer flu vaccination

No gaps in service since houlihans pharmacy is already located in Darnley.

No gaps

Although they say they provide a service, very difficult to access Houlihans as always busy and not easy to get to.

**Diabetes** 

The number of new homes developed recently require adequate services.

Only one pharmacy nearby, Houlihans Darnley and they are always busy

I haven't identified any gaps

I currently travel to Newton Mearns for a doctors clinic. My dentist is in thornlibank. It would be ideal to have somewhere local to go.

A good doctors surgery would be highly beneficial and would resolve pressure on the oversubscribed Pollok health Centre and others

There is only houlihan pharmacy in the neighbourhood which is not sufficient for the needs of the whole area.

The pharmacy first service is provided in the current pharmacies but I feel they are always busy and although the service is provided it sometimes takes time to speak to a pharmacist to get advice

The gap is not in the breadth of service but in its depth. The identified area is home to about 10,000 people and the one pharmacy in the area is not sufficient. Other medical services are also under pressure like doctors, dentist practice.

Pharmacy first plus service

The services provided by the existing shop are very poor, it has changed hands many times over the past few years and has never given a good service during any of the large corporate companies who have ran it.

Late night opening and online orders

No

No, my Pharmacy offers all services listed above and more. They are a great Pharmacy and I don't think there is any need for anything else in the area.

I have no issues with pharmacy services in the area

With delivery of medication from pharmacies becoming the norm there is a delay or almost no communication from GP or pharmacy when the medication is coming and sometimes it can come late. When it's the elderly peoples medication they panic and when you try to phone

Pharmacy they take a long time to respond and sometimes there is no answer. A local pharmacy in this area for the elderly is needed.

I do feel the pharmacy we have is adequate, however, a lot of the time the medication that the pharmacy should have is out of stock which means going to another pharmacy. I feel with the population of Darnley we need another pharmacy.

Chiropody service not nhs open for everyone

Pharmacy is very slow and is unable to keep up with demand I usually just go to boots in silverburn much quicker

Since the Sandyford services have been removed from Pollok, perhaps an idea would be to include sexual health/ reproductive health services in the proposal

There should be the provision of a sexual health clinic for people.

Somewhere they can get contraception and speak about serial issues.

Perhaps more support and services to people with long term illness.

Also delivery prescription service could be extended to individuals who need it (apart from the elderly). E.g like me an nhs worker who works 12 hr shifts or nightshift, i never have the time to pick up my medication.

. I am aware that gluten free foods can be ordered in the pharmacy by what about dairy free? For the lactose intolerant liks myself.

The wait times at these pharmacies are too long I often travel to other pharmacies to get my medicine due to this.

No gaps but an increased number of options is better. The Well pharmacy close to the area is shut on a number of occasions

There is no pharmacy near by and would be a great addition

All of the services provided are adequate for the needs of the community

With the many new housing developments in the neighbourhood area, another pharmacy will help match this increase in demand

NHS and private flu jabs

**Blood Pressure Tests** 

Very long waits for prescriptions due to lack of pharmacy options

The services supplied are being stretched due to the volume of new houses being built in the area in question.

I think that my service is not at it's fullest

I don't think there are any gaps but the service in the pharmacy I do go to is not the best and hasn't been for some time and this is purely due to the overwhelming volume of the footfall within.

I believe there is a need for a pharmacy in the area massively.

Travel clinic

Do you think the proposed opening hours by the Intended Applicant are appropriate?

### Pharmacy opening hours

The NHS Model Hours of Service Scheme requires all Community Pharmacies to open, as a minimum, Monday to Saturday – 9.00am to 5:30pm. They can opt to have up to 2 half days per week – afternoon from 1.00pm. Each pharmacy can close for 1 hour at lunchtime. Any longer opening hours will be provided at the discretion of the pharmacy contractor.

### Responses

These hours are not suitable for people who have work commitments during the day. Houlihan's nearby also offers 24 hour prescription pick up.

Don't think it should be closed on a Sunday

Nhs is 24/7 and prescriptions are issued from out of hours

If they intend to compete with local pharmacies I think they should offer better services.a houlihans has later opening hours

These are standard pharmacy hours in the area.

Pharmacy stores are needing to open for longer periods of time to provide care and analgesic advice to patients within greater Glasgow and Clyde

Would like late evening opening hours

The area within the immediate radius of the proposed pharmacy is currently made up of private housing, most people are in full time employment

We need a pharnacy which has extended opening hours and is valuable out side of 'normal' working hours

Extended hours would help people who work daytime and people who require medical help out with normal hours

We already have a pharmacy in the area that is opened longer (x2)

Pharmacy should be open Sundays and later hours to accommodate those that work during the day.

Working parents tend to collect repeat prescriptions on a Saturday as it better for them time wise.

Would be nice to have sunday opening

It would be good to have one day where the pharmacy opens later for working families.

Just right

For this to be an effective & welcome addition to the community and to cause the least traffic nuisance & build up at peak times etc (morning & evening rush hour & school times) I think

extended opening hours & open 7days would be a must I don't feel the disruption this would cause with the extra traffic at these times is worth it when there is a pharmacy just along the road

There is already a pharmacy at either end of this road so why is there a need for another? Also it's not just a pharmacy to be opened so why is the survey not for all service last that will be provided ie GP and dental service

Would like Sunday opening half day too.

There have been times i have ran out of my levothyroxine and had to wait for the pharmacy to open to get an emergency supply. This is important to me as i have my thyroid removed and i can risk missing a day.

The pharmacy dosnt have to be open but perhaps similar to an on call?

Should open Sunday for few hours if possible

Good opening hours. In line with surgery opening times. Will be a good addition to the community

I'd suggest leaving it open until 6.30-7pm to account for those who working till 5-6 or for those on a tight schedule

### Responses

Substance misuse services may encourage drug taking in the surrounding woodlands, immediately next to the proposed site. This area is used regularly by families and children.

Already provided for in community

No requirement for another pharmacy within residential housing area. There is a pharmacy within retail units just 5 minutes walk from this site.

NHS Pharmacy First Scotland is very useful, and needs to be better promoted.

I think having Houllihans pharmacy so close by there is no requirement for another so close.

These areas are already well provided at local pharmacies

I am concerned after buying a new build in a scenic area that there will be an increase in traffic and risk of loitering with possible inappropriate disposal of litter and other items

This would meet the needs of my family.

Would welcome such services

Adequate service already in place.

Excellant, any access to healthcare/ harm reduction advice and support is excellany for the local area

Delighted they offer these services

Why do we need a pharmacy so close to a new residential area especially with a substance misuse service (x2)

Strongly opposed to offering the Substance misuse and needle exchange service in an area with young families! This service is already provided at pollock health centre.

These services are covered by pharmacies within walking distance of the proposed site and therefore not required.

Not a good area for needle exchange. Already have 2 pharmacies in close proximity of intended site

As long as the services provided can be easily accessed, its fine. Pharmacy First is a great idea as it will allow me to go to the Pharmacy rather than my GP.

Yes this would help as the pharmacy next to sainsburys in difficult to access due to traffic volumes

I feel these services are already readily available at several locations in this & surrounding area

The provisions listed above are adequately covered by other local pharmacies

All the above would be useful in our neighbourhood.

All essential services that I'm glad someone closer can offer

### Suffice

The road in and out of the Darnley mill is too narrow and already busy with just residents to add more traffic for people using this would only add to the already busy street and there would be a higher risk to pedestrians, kids playing doff walkers etc. There is a pharmacy only 2 minutes down the road that provides the exact same as what is being proposed above so unsure why this is necessary.

What is required is the community at this time.

Great / Good services (x6)

Not required as these are already being offered within the area.

All of these services are already provided by pharmacies

Services are fine

Concerned about the needle exchange. Having just bought an expensive property across from the proposed pharmacy, I worry about undesirable individuals coming to the area and using the woodland area for drug use.

Will be a great addition to the community pharmacy services and increase patient access to care

Great idea as long as people on methadone don't cause trouble in what is a quite area.

I have serious concerns about substance misuse services being a part of the pharmacy. This is a residential, family area and the route past on Corselet Road is used by young children going to and from school as well as this being the entry point to the Dams to Darnley Country Park. I would feel unsafe with or without children when there are addicts frequenting the premises and being in the locality. I believe this would affect the quality of life if the local residents and may also affect property prices.

Good service for UTI

Unnecessary as there is a pharmacy next to McDonald's etc at Darnley Mains.

Sounds great to me

They are adequate and provide reasonable serviced to the community

Already provided

I believe that the provisions in place are enough to combat majority of the health issues in Glasgow

The services listed above are necessary to service the diverse population of Darnley and the surrounding areas. Furthermore, they will help relieve some of the strain on the health service, particularly general practice. There is also further service expansion possible for example with

the pharmacy first plus service, which as I understand is not currently offered in the area. This would be particularly useful in the proposed location in a health centre.

The number of services provided makes the pharmacy at 500 Corselet Road a strong competitor against other pharmacies in the area, and can potentially be the primary pharmacy for Parkhouse estate area. However with more services such as NHS and private flu jabs & Blood Pressure Tests, it will give the pharmacy a better chance at competing.

Good wide use of services. Helps locality build as community.

This is a good range of services being provided as it cover the basics and more, catering to every need

Will provide extra care & service to the community

I think the services mentioned above are important for the community.


I think it is invaluable and would be a welcomed list of services in a growing area with increased housing and families.

Exactly what is needed in a pharmacy.


As the area continues to expand and residents look to enhance their overall health and well-being, do you support the opening of a new pharmacy in the Old Darnley Mill?

### Responses

GP's continue to send patients away from surgeries. Any extra help is appreciated

There is already a pharmacy in the area

Feel that the residential area will have too much traffic within such a small road, loitering within vicinity that private house owners do not want.

I currently use the Houlihan pharmacy which is in the drawn boundary area. I live very close to Darnley Mill and would welcome a pharmacy nearby, however do have concerns whether it is necessary given the proximity of other pharmacies in the area.

It will take business away from existing pharmacies if given permission and if people will travel further to this new pharmacy

It will likely cause existing services that provide a better service to lose business and get result in them reducing service or withdrawing services.

I don't know how it may impact on other businesses but it would provide a valuable service to residents particularly those who do not drive and may find accessing some of the others difficult.

Would be a positive one. The other pharmacy in the area are far too slow and inefficient.

Will be easier for people to access healthcare advice and support as it seems to be impossible to see a gp in the local area.

It will help with the expanding community

We already have an established pharmacy with longer opening hours on the facility (unless it's getting moved here!) and a health centre close by at Silverburn (x2)

There is already adequate services provided by both houihans pharmacy and pollock health centre.





The traffic in & around this proposed site already causes congestion delay & frustration not to mention terrible road surfaces due to the sheer volume of traffic which causes severe damage to vehicles & even more chaos when it eventually gets repaired...I do not think this is a service which is needed at this location due to this reading that these same services are already available

This road leading into this facility cannot cannot cope with the increase in traffic, Corselet Road is way too narrow to cope with the traffic demand.

We are at present dealing with a new housing estate in this area and with 50 houses the amount of cars coming out of this area alone is far too much for Corselet Road.

This was a green belt area with a natural park for wildlife and walking, the increase in traffic this facility will bring will have a detrimental effect on the area and park.

I'm also concerned about traffic coming and going via corselet road. The current traffic lights set up doesn't look like it would cope with the amount of traffic coming to and from the pharmacy.


