The projects impact on the volunteers:

- 100% of volunteers feel more connected to nature
- 100% of volunteers feel the project has had a positive impact on the local greenspace
- 85.8% of the volunteers are more likely to visit local greenspaces
- 100% of the volunteers have learnt new skills
- 71.5% feel they have improved their employment opportunities
- 85.7% feel more confident
- 100% of the volunteers feel more connected to their local community
- 85.7% of volunteers feel the project has had a positive impact on the local community
- 100% of the volunteers feel their well-being has improved
