Note: Text in orange boxes are countries that require you to quarantine unless you can prove fully vaccinated status

Indonesia	<p>You must present proof of vaccination status to enter Indonesia and/or to travel domestically within Indonesia.</p> <p>If you're not fully vaccinated and are medically exempt, you will need to produce your exemption documents at check in (according to your airline policy) and on arrival in Jakarta.</p> <p>If you have had COVID-19 and recovered within 30 days prior to departure, you are exempt from the requirement to show proof of vaccination and negative RT-PCR prior to departure. However, you will be required to take a RT-PCR test upon arrival and show the recovery certificate from a hospital in your country of origin.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required: If you have received a booster along with the two initial vaccinations, you can travel without showing a negative COVID 19 test result.</p> <p>Travellers who have received two vaccinations must show a negative antigen test taken within 1x24 hours or a negative RT-PCR test obtained 3x24 hours prior to departure. You may be offered a booster on-site before departure. Travellers who have received a first dose of vaccine must show a negative RT-PCR test taken 3x24 hours prior to departure. Travellers who are unable to be vaccinated due to a medical condition must show a negative PCR test taken 3x24 hours prior to departure. You will need a doctor's letter specifying why you cannot be vaccinated.</p> <p>Coronavirus - Indonesia travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p>
Liberia	<p>All travellers aged 18 years and above must show proof of COVID-19 vaccination upon arrival. No negative COVID-19 test result is required for travellers.</p> <p>All travellers without proof of vaccination will be returned to their country of embarkation.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required: To be considered fully vaccinated you must have had both doses of a two-dose COVID-19 vaccine and the second dose must have been received at least two weeks prior to arriving in Liberia, or have had one-dose of the Johnson and Johnson COVID-19 vaccine at least two weeks prior to arriving in Liberia. Liberia recognises the following vaccines: Janssen/JJ, Pfizer-BioNTech; Moderna; AstraZeneca; Covaxin; Covishield; BIBP/Sinopharm; Sinovac.</p> <p>Your final vaccine dose must have been administered at least 14 days prior to travel.</p> <p>Entry requirements - Liberia travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p>
Marshall Islands	<p>To enter the Republic of Marshall Islands, you will need to be fully vaccinated and have received any boosters you are eligible for. You will need to submit your NHS COVID Pass to your airline prior to your flight. The requirement to be fully vaccinated applies to all travellers aged five and over. From 1 October 2022, all travellers over the age of six months will need to be vaccinated in order to enter. Travellers will need to submit their</p>

Travellers will be required to take a rapid antigen test on arrival and must self-isolate if the result is positive.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required: Primary doses and any boosters you are eligible for.</p> <p>Entry requirements - Marshall Islands travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p>
Micronesia	<p>Vaccination or certification is not required unless the traveller comes from an infected area.</p> <p>Entry requirements - Micronesia (Federated States of) travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p> <p>Regulations – Federated States of Micronesia (visit-micronesia.fm)</p>
Nauru	<p>All passengers must be fully vaccinated at least 14 days prior to their travel date. A negative Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) must be taken within 24 hours of flight departure. Can't find info on "fully vaccinated" status</p>
Niger	<p>Travellers who have not been vaccinated against COVID-19 must present a negative COVID-19 PCR test certificate taken within 72 hours before arrival to the airport authorities. Before travelling, you should register and upload your PCR test results online on the Trusted Travel site. Unvaccinated travellers will need to quarantine for 7 days. Unvaccinated travellers who are staying in Niger for more than 7 days will need to quarantine at their final destination (home, hotel) for 7 days. On the 7th day of quarantine, you must take a COVID-19 antigen test at a Government agreed testing centre. If the test is negative, you can end your quarantine. If the test is positive, you must follow local guidance on quarantine procedures.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required: Fully vaccinated travellers are those who have had the primary course (not including boosters). It must be more than 4 weeks since the last dose.</p> <p>Coronavirus - Niger travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p>
Pitcairn Island	<p>If you're not fully vaccinated, you will not be allowed entry to Pitcairn.</p> <p>Pitcairn Island will accept the UK's proof of COVID-19 recovery and vaccination record and proof of COVID-19 vaccination issued in the Crown Dependencies. Your final vaccine dose must have been administered at least 14 days prior to travel. Your NHS appointment card from vaccination centres is not designed to be used as proof of vaccination and should not be used to demonstrate your vaccine status.</p> <p>In addition to being fully vaccinated, there are other requirements regarding PCR and RAT testing prior to embarkation and landing. These requirements are different depending on how you travel to Pitcairn. Details are available on the Pitcairn Island Government website.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required: No information on doses found. Assumed it is primary doses. Your final vaccine dose must have been administered at least 14 days prior to travel.</p>

Sierra Leone	<p>The Government of Sierra Leone has withdrawn for COVID-19 testing for all passengers, regardless of vaccination status. Proof of vaccination may be requested on arrival.</p> <p>Proof of vaccination status</p> <p>Sierra Leone will accept the UK's <u>proof of COVID-19 recovery and vaccination record</u> and proof of COVID-19 vaccination issued in the Crown Dependencies. Your final vaccine dose must have been administered at least 14 days prior to travel. Your NHS appointment card from vaccination centres is not designed to be used as proof of vaccination and should not be used to demonstrate your vaccine status.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • have had both doses of a two-dose COVID-19 vaccine and the second dose must have been received at least two weeks prior to arriving in Sierra Leone, or • have had one-dose of the Johnson and Johnson COVID-19 vaccine at least two weeks prior to arriving in Sierra Leone. <p>Entry requirements - Sierra Leone travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p>
Solomon Islands	<p>The Solomon Islands will accept the UK's <u>proof of COVID-19 recovery and vaccination record</u> and proof of COVID-19 vaccination issued in the Crown Dependencies. Your final vaccine dose must have been administered at least 4 weeks prior to travel. Your NHS appointment card from vaccination centres is not designed to be used as proof of vaccination and should not be used to demonstrate your vaccine status.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required:</p> <p>All incoming travellers must be fully (double) vaccinated.</p> <p>If you are 12 years old or above and are double vaccinated, you do not need to undertake any COVID-19 test prior to entry into Solomon Islands. You will need to show proof of vaccination.</p> <p>For any child under 12 years, it is recommended but not mandatory that they are double vaccinated before entering the Solomon Islands. Children under 12 who are not double vaccinated must undertake one COVID-19 PCR within a period of 72 hours before arrival into the country. Timor-Leste	<p>Travellers who have not received a full vaccination for COVID-19 shall undertake 10 days mandatory quarantine designated by the competent authorities of the Ministry of Health. Alternatively, they could undertake home quarantine provided that the facility is suitable and with the authorisation from the Director General of Public Health Service.</p> <p>Number of vaccines required: full vaccination = two doses</p> <p>Entry requirements - East Timor (Timor-Leste) travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p>

Turkmenistan	<p>All citizens of foreign countries arriving into Turkmenistan must have a physical document confirming that they have been vaccinated against COVID-19, or a certificate confirming the presence of antibodies to COVID-19 (IgM, IgG). The vaccination document should confirm that the last vaccination dose was provided at least 42 days prior to arrival in Turkmenistan</p> <p>If an individual cannot be vaccinated for health reasons then they must provide a physical medical certificate confirming this AND a certificate confirming the presence of antibodies to COVID-19 (IgM, IgG).</p> <p>Entry requirements - Turkmenistan travel advice - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</p>
